Many of the issues have been raised within the Plan. Lack of funding is main issue, but some actions are being taken where funding has been made available, e.g. Cycle Loan Scheme, and Additional Cycle Parking following successful application for Taith funding by Gareth Jones. Gareth and Ricky have been in discussion with Gwynedd Council and Sustrans regarding improved cycle paths in the vicinity of the University. Information on sustainability could be part of staff induction sessions(need more on this) e. List of practical tips for specific buildings of what you can do (would help to empower people who can't do certain things e.g. turn down heating) f. Better communication e.g. via Environmental Champions/Building Reps g. Need to look at heating and lights in buildings, lights left on, heating to high... h. Investor saves e.g. solar panels, tidal turbines. i. When people see, for example, taps being left on unnecessarily a reporting scheme could be in place. A reporting sheet could be placed in each room/building for staff to note down any problems/issues in the buildings. This will enable the Estates to be more informed of problems around the University and be able to resolve them quickly. j. Encouraging ownership of the issues - the incentive to reduce energy use and staff/students taking responsibility is low.
